

# Network + Technician



Network+ technicians have the ability to describe the features and functions of networking components and to manage, maintain, troubleshoot, install, operate and configure basic network infrastructure. They speak with LAN Managers or Network Analysts about specific problems on the network, and are involved in updating and/or fixing existing systems.

- Approximately 8 weeks

- A+ Certification or 18 - 24 months of experience in the industry.
