You may qualify if:

1. You *are* enrolled as a full-time Career and Technical Education (CTE) program major and pursuing your degree.
2. You *are* enrolled as a full-time CTE student with 12 semester credit hours during the Fall & Spring and/or summer semesters. HCC will not pay childcare assistance for academic courses (distance education or developmental classes). These classes do not count toward the 12 SCH hours.
3. You *are* taking the majority percentage of courses in the classroom setting.
4. You have a 2.0 Grade Point Average or better for previous semester and semester applying for.
5. You meet one of the Special Populations Categories. (*See student application*)

The following documents must be submitted with application:

- Copy of current Degree Plan (Must match iAAR report in PS student center)
- Copy of State ID/License
- Current Class Schedule
- Financial Aid Award Letter
- Proof of Income
- Public Assistance Award Letter (WIC, Food Stamps, Medicaid, TANF, SSDI)
- Birth Certificate child(ren)
- Daycare/Registered Home License
- Daycare outstanding balance, if any
- Proof of agreement with Licensed child care provider (Your selected provider must be licensed and agree to participate in the program).
