HCC approved to launch bachelor's degree programs in 2023

Houston Community College (HCC) has been approved as a Level 2 baccalaureate granting institution, beginning with four-year degrees in Artificial Intelligence & Robotics and Healthcare Management.

The announcement was made by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) Board of Trustees at its 2022 Annual Meeting Atlanta, Ga., recently. SACSCOC is the accrediting organization for HCC and other colleges and universities across 14 states in the southern United States.

HCC will launch its new bachelor's degree programs in fall 2023.

The Bachelor of Applied Technology in Artificial Intelligence and Robotics will address a growing and critical need for skilled workers in a rapidly evolving technical field. Over the last decade, Artificial Intelligence (AI) has gained a substantial foothold in a variety of industries. The

National Security Commission on Artificial Intelligence (2021) recognizes AI as "already ubiquitous in everyday life" and that "application of AI techniques to solve problems is...turning once-fantastical ideas into realities across a range of disciplines."

Graduates of this program will enter a profession with 2,586 annual job openings in our region and a median annual salary of \$97,200.

The Bachelor of Applied Science in Healthcare Management will prepare students for career advancement or entry-level healthcare managerial positions. The degree program enables working professionals to advance their career by focusing on leadership skills, knowledge, and credentials in the healthcare management field.

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics cites Medical and Health Services Managers as a growing occupational field based on increased demand for healthcare services as the baby-boom population ages.

As medical service needs increase, the need for managers "who organize and manage medical information and healthcare staff" will also increase.

Graduates of this program will enter a profession with 1,752 annual job openings in the Houston region and a median annual salary of \$64,200.

"We are continually exploring ways to provide relevant programs and instruction that serve the needs of students and employers in our service area," said HCC Chancellor Cesar Maldonado, Ph.D., P.E. "With these two inaugural bachelor's degree programs, we give students an opportunity to start and complete their four-year education on the same HCC campus."





The cost of a dream? Scholarships and financial aid help many students pay for college

Houston Community College's highly experienced financial aid outreach representatives are experts in providing support to students to make applying for financial aid easy and straightforward.

Affordable HCC degrees transfer seamlessly to four-year universities

Earning an Associate Degree at HCC not only provides graduates a path toward skills needed in today's job landscape at far less tuition costs, but can also lead to a seamless transfer to a bevy of great universities.

Students who choose HCC for their first two years of college save dramatically over the cost of completing two years at other area colleges and universities. The cost per semester at HCC for Texas residents is about \$1,500 per semester or \$6,000 for two years without financial aid.

The cost for Texas residents to attend Texas universities ranges from about \$3,500 to \$8,000 for a semester (as much \$32,000 for two years).

HCC has more than 300 transfer plans with 65 universities in eight major areas of study, including Business, Education, Science and Technology, Engineering, Health Sciences, Public Service, Industry and Manufacturing, and Art and Design.

"What's more, HCC students are in great demand at our partner universities," said Dr. Norma Perez, HCC's vice chancellor of instruction. "Transfer universities report that HCC students perform very well, which means many encourage transfers by offering various scholarship and grant opportunities."

An HCC team of professionals is also available every step of the way to help students enroll and to apply for financial aid.


