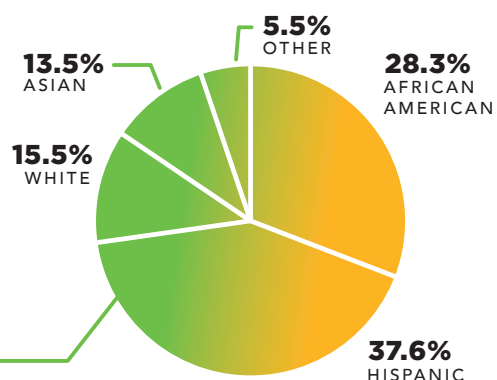

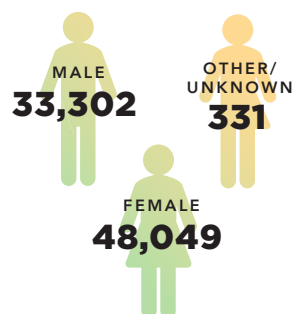

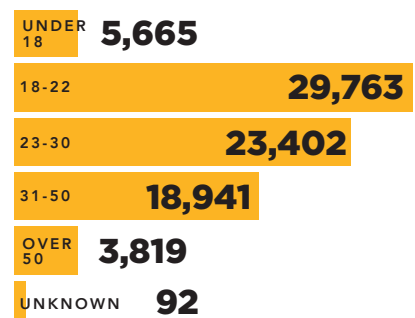

Seniors can take free, discounted classes

Senior citizens who are 65 or older can take classes for up to six credit hours per semester without paying tuition. In addition, normally charged fees for up to six credit hours per semester are also waived.

For those seniors who fall between the ages of 55 to 65, classes can be taken for half off. The discount applies to academic and workforce courses that have not already been filled.

Participants must receive a grade of C or better to continue receiving the discount each semester. Some courses may have additional specific charges.

Workforce Center offering more face-to-face training for in-demand careers

The ability to get hands-on training in thriving workforce fields is expanding at the Workforce Center at HCC South campus.

HCC's School of Continuing Education is offering Construction Project Management, Bilingual Electrical Technician and Residential Construction as hybrid courses in 2022 instead of fully online. Students will spend at least half of their time studying real-world structures and working on projects at the 1900 Airport Boulevard campus.

The Workforce Center, the newest building at the campus, will offer the courses in the evenings. Tuition is between \$1,100 and \$1,705 for each program. To help cover

tuition costs, students can check their eligibility for state and federal grants.
